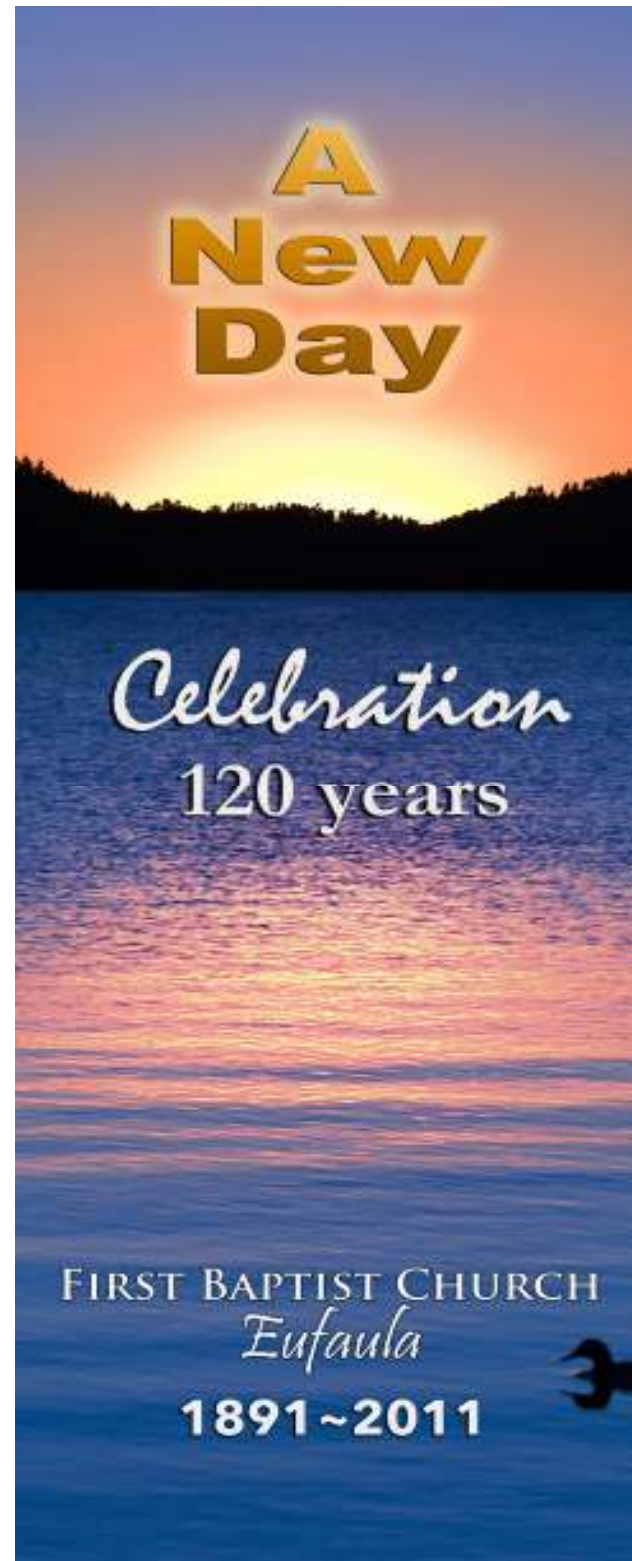

Brief History of the Church

Several years before the Eufaula Baptist Church was organized, H. F. Buckner was here as a missionary to the Indians. He organized several Indian churches in the area.

One thing of interest is that the Baptist Churches of Kentucky sent building material, partially assembled, in ox wagons and erected the Buckner home which was about three miles east of town.

A little later the American Home Mission Society sent Miss Eliza J. Quinton here as a missionary. She and Bro. A. J. Essex helped in the early organization of the Church.

On April 25th, 1891, the Baptist Church of Eufaula was formally organized with eleven members. The name at the time was Buckner Memorial Baptist Church of Eufaula and in time became First Baptist Church of Eufaula, Ok.

In January 1892, Services were held twice a month

In 1919 the Church went full time with services each Sunday.

In February, 1894 the first church building was built and dedicated, with the help of the American Baptist Home Mission Board. In 1959 our present building was dedicated and we worship there today.
